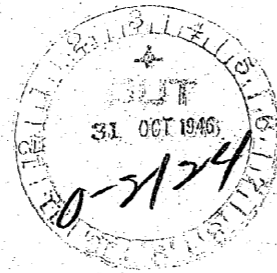

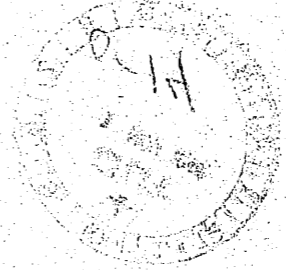

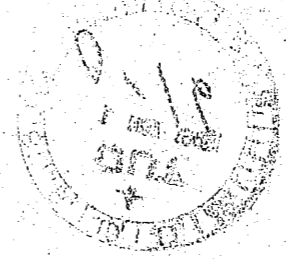

A report providing the information stipulated in paragraph 1 b of the above memorandum will be made to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, covering the distribution of the salt.

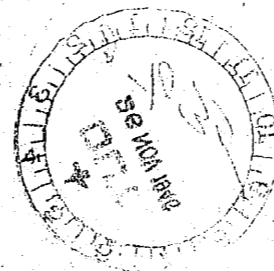
